

STAGE 5 BAY 8

Shotgun

Sporting Clays Trailer

RULES: USPSA Latest Edition

COURSE DESIGNER: Michael Craig

START POSITION: Standing in shooting cage 1-5 as directed by trapper & RO. Shotgun initially at low ready. May be raised to shoulder before or upon audible “pull” signal.

STAGE PROCEDURE:

Clay birds will be mechanically thrown from 5 different machines from a sporting clays trailer. Each shooter will engage each type of clay bird from 5 different positions for a total of 25 Clay-birds. Shooter will shoot from enclosed shooting positions and will take turns shooting from each position by rotating positions left to right. When it is his turn the shooter will load 1 shotgun shell. Once the shooter is ready he will call for the bird from the trapper by calling “pull”. Once target is engaged shooter will open chamber, leave empty and keep muzzle upward. Once everyone on the line has engaged a single bird each will rotate to the next position with action open and muzzle pointed up and repeat until all 25 birds have been engaged. Shooters who are not on the line will keep score for each other by marking shooters score sheet with a hit or miss.

SCORING: Virginia Count - Fixed Time
25 seconds 125 pts

ROUNDS: Shotgun Birdshot 6 shot or smaller.
25 Total

TARGETS: Claybirds

SCORED HITS: 1 BB to break Claybirds = 5pts

START-STOP: Audible - Last shot



Here is an example of shooting from fixed positions using a Sporting Clays trailer. Birds will be shot at distances of 10-25yds. Birds will be thrown knowing most will have tactical / practical shotguns.

SETUP NOTES:

NOTES: All guns must be remain pointed downrange at all times.
